Appendix 4: Missing Data Analysis for Key Variables

This appendix compares whether our sample of MPs is non-randomly different from their counterparts (within their party) who did not respond to our requests for householders. The only statistically significant difference concerns population density for Conservative MPs, where the MPs who responded to us represented significantly less dense ridings than their Conservative colleagues who did not respond.
