### Pension letter of the States General bestowed on William Henry, Electoral Prince of Brandenburg (1648)<sup>1</sup>

The States General of the United Netherlands

All those who will be shown this present [document], greetings, let it be known that, as it has pleased the almighty God in his divine mercy to bless and bring joy to the most illustrious highborn prince and lord, Frederick William, Markgrave of Brandenburg [...] and the illustrious highborn princess and lady, Louise, Markgravine of Brandenburg [...] with the birth of a son and electoral prince and lord, and that their Electoral highnesses, holding and counting us among the number of their best friends and neighbours, have invited us [...] to stand as witnesses over the Holy Christian Baptism of the abovementioned first highborn son and Electoral Prince and Lord, and furthermore, as by other treaties and demonstrations, their Electoral Highnesses actively [*datelick*] show the sincere friendship, favour, and affection in which they hold Us and these United Netherlands, for the conservation and maintenance of its prosperity, so it is that we, to show from our side that the beforementioned honour, favour and boon not only pleases Us very much, and holds Us much obliged to their Electoral Highnesses, but also [because we] desire to leave the beforementioned Electoral prince and lord a certain memory and monument of obligation and thankfulness for the beforementioned honour, favour and affection of their Electoral Highnesses, so that the [...] prince, having come of age, has more reason to remember the same, to follow it, and to step into the footsteps of his [...] parents and forefathers and, for that reason, to hold Us in similar affection and favour, we have promised and constituted, and do hereby promise and constitute the beforementioned Electoral Prince and Lord [space left open for name] [...] a pension of four thousand pounds [...] per annum [...] to the greater security of which we have had this [document] sealed with Our Great Seal, initialed by the President, and signed by Our Secretary,
