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### *Consent.*

This is a research study of how COVID-19 has affected wildlife consumption (the use of wildlife products for food and/or medicine). This research involves questions about the health and policy implications of wildlife consumption. You must be at least 18 years old to participate in this research.

Participation in this research is voluntary. You have the right to not participate in this study. You may choose not to answer specific questions. Your answers are anonymous. The researcher has no access to identifying information such as your name or address.

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*Definitions.* For the purpose of this survey, we define “wild animals” as traditionally non-domesticated animals that are either farmed or caught from the wild. This includes all animals that are not chickens, cows, pigs, goats, or sheep. For example, frogs, snakes, bamboo rats, and crabs are considered wild animals, regardless of whether they are farmed or caught from the wild.

We define “consumption” in terms of general use for either food or medicine.
