This includes all animals that are not chickens, cows, pigs, goats, or sheep. For example, frogs, snakes, bamboo rats, and crabs are considered wild animals, regardless of whether they are farmed or caught from the wild.

We define "consumption" in terms of general use for either food or medicine.
