


Fig. 1. CLIWOC (British, 1750-1829).




Fig. 2. Slave Voyages (British, post-1750).




Fig. 5. Britain in *CLIWOC*.




Fig. 6. Britain in Slave Voyages.




Fig. 9. Africa in Slave Voyages.




Fig. 10. Africa in Green's New General Collection.




Fig. 11. Africa in *Pyrates*.




Fig. 12. Africa in Captain Singleton.




Fig. 14. The mid-Atlantic in *CLIWOC*.




Fig. 16. The mid-Atlantic in sea nonfiction.




Fig. 17. The Indian and western Pacific Oceans in *CLIWOC*.




Fig. 20. Western South and Central America in Defoe's *New Voyage*.




Fig. 22. India in Raynal's History.




Fig. 23. India in Smollett's Compendium.




Fig. 24. Western South and Central America in Dampier's *New Voyage*.
