
Dear Mr. Hyman:

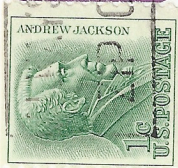
