Group information for first-time participants: I started this group soon after the earthquakes in Turkey and Syria as a post-disaster solidarity group to help students and scholars from the region to focus on writing, wherever they are. The purpose is to create space for writing in a virtual communal atmosphere that boosts motivation and helps structure writing schedules. **There's no topic discussion,** just a place to work for however much of the session you're able to join. We have participants from many disciplines and professional levels join, and many report getting good writing done.

I strongly recommend closing email/social media apps and silencing notifications if you can.
