Appendix A Sampled Firms

Table 1 has a list of the firms in the sample. These firms represent a significant cross-section of cybersecurity service providers in the United States.

Acuson Corp, now a part of Siemens Medical Solutions, started as a pioneer in ultrasound technology. It provides wide-range of cybersecurity services to a variety of small and mid-sized firms.

CACI International Inc. is a multinational professional services and information technology company that provides wide range of cybersecurity solutions for the military, defense and intelligence agencies.

Cisco Systems Inc. is a global leader in networking and cybersecurity solutions, with a significant stake in developing secure communication systems and protecting information infrastructures across several sectors.

General Dynamics Corp. is a traditional defense contractor. Their portfolio includes a dedicated information technology sector responsible for cybersecurity solutions for government and commercial customers.

International Business Machines (IBM) Corporation has a legacy in technological innovation and has evolved to become a dominant player in the cybersecurity space, providing a comprehensive suite of security solutions and services to both government and private entities.

Ratexchange Corp, Symantec Corp, and Verizon Communications Inc. each have unique offerings in the cybersecurity space. Symantec, known for its Norton antivirus software, is an established player in consumer and enterprise cybersecurity solutions. Verizon, as a major telecommunications company, also provides cybersecurity solutions as part of its broader portfolio. Ratexchange Corporation is a major B2B e-commerce company.
