Science and education

- University professors (unless subject covered by other categories); scientists
- Teachers, school principals, and any other educators, incl. museum staff, librarians, archivists, translators

Culture

- Any individual actively engaging in or contributing to music, art, theatre, cinema, photography, literature, poetry, fashion, graphic design, illustration, etc.
- Teachers and professors of any of the above

Politics, diplomacy, and statehood

- Active or former politicians at local, state, and international level; ambassadors and diplomatic staff (incl. civil servants in the ministry of foreign affairs); heads of major state institutions
- Individuals engaged in re-establishing independent statehood; rescuers of Jews during WWII

Services to the state, judiciary, civil servants

- Civil servants in local and state government (except those falling under other categories)
- Members of the judiciary, such as judges, prosecutors, clerks
- Other posts in public service such as auditors, police, firefighters, rescue workers

Sport

- Participants of major national or international sporting events, championships, and the Olympics
- Coaches, trainers, teachers, doctors, and any other staff associated with sports teams as well as representatives of sports-related associations; practitioners of any sports activity

Economy and business

- Business founders and owners (unless primarily covered by another category); members of company boards; high-ranking or long-serving private sector employees
- Individuals working in professions not covered by other categories (e.g. lawyers, architects, etc) or engaged in any other activity primarily related to business and production

Motherhood

• Women who gave birth to, raised, and/or cared for a certain number of children

Health and social services

- Professors of medicine, doctors (including veterinarians), nurses, and hospital workers
- Social workers and any other individuals involved in care for other people

Social and environmental activism

- Individuals involved in social initiatives that are not state-sanctioned or related to the state administration
- Recognised efforts may include but are not limited to environmental conservation, humanitarian
 affairs and human rights, preservation of local folklore and national heritage, philanthropy

Press, media, and TV

- Journalists, television and radio presenters, documentary film makers
- Publicists, publishers, and media executives

Military, aviation, and seafaring

• *Members of the military; civilian pilots; sea captains*

Saving of life (incl. blood donors)

Individuals who have saved a life or are regular blood donors

Religious life

- Clergy or staff of any church or religious community
- Any individuals promoting activities directly related to religious and/or spiritual life
