

# Appendix

## Excluded Words and Phrases

Below are the exact words and terms as searched for in each dictionary:

- God: 'god', 'jesus', 'christ', 'savior', 'saviour', 'our lord', 'the lord', 'holy spirit'
- Blessings: 'bless', 'faith', 'pray', 'divine', 'salvation', 'worship', 'sin', 'sins', 'sinful', 'sinner', 'original sin', 'heaven', 'holy', 'spiritual'
- Scripture: 'scripture', 'bible', 'biblical', 'psalm', 'ten commandments'
- Religion: 'religio', 'christian', 'gospel'
- Political: 'judeo', 'religious freedom', 'religious libert', 'freedom of religion', 'christian nation'
- All religious terms: 'god', 'jesus', 'christ', 'savior', 'saviour', 'our lord', 'the lord', 'holy spirit', 'scripture', 'bible', 'biblical', 'psalm', 'ten commandments', 'bless', 'pray', 'faith', 'divine', 'salvation', 'worship', 'sin', 'sins', 'sinful', 'sinner', 'original sin', 'heaven', 'holy', 'spiritual', 'religio', 'christian', 'gospel'
- Dogwhistles: 'pornography', 'gender ideology', 'gender agenda', 'pro-family', 'traditional famil', 'traditional marriage', 'unborn', 'pro-life', 'protect life', 'protecting life', 'abortion agenda'

Note that searches were not limited to exact words and instead were used as root words. For example, 'pray' would include 'prayed', 'prayerful', 'prayerfully', etc. As such, we added in spaces to ensure we didn't capture terms that didn't match our root word for certain terms. For example, we didn't search for 'sin', as that would include terms as 'sincerely' and 'Wisconsin', but instead searched for 'sin '. We also specifically excluded words and phrases that weren't religious. Listed below is the initial word included in our search, followed by all words and phrases that were excluded from the search for that specific word:

- god: god forbid, goddard
- christ: christmas, christopher, christian, christians, christianity, christmases, christa, christi, chirstie, christine, christina, christy, christmastime, christon, gilchrist, chistiansted, christensen, christen, christening
- the lord: the lords and ladies, lord lieutenant
- faith: faith and credit, faithfully execute, faithfully executed, faithfully to execute
- pray: prayer and pledge, prayer and the pledge
- salvation: salvation army
- holy: holyoke
- gospel: gospel music, gospel lyres
- heaven: heaven forbid

- protect life: protect life and property, protecting life and property

We also note that while the above was done in Python, we hand coded some specific words:

- Removed “anti-abortion agenda” from the Dogwhistle dictionary
- Added in ‘ sin.’, ‘ sin,’, ‘ sins.’, and ‘ sins,’ to the Blessings and All Religious Terms dictionaries.
