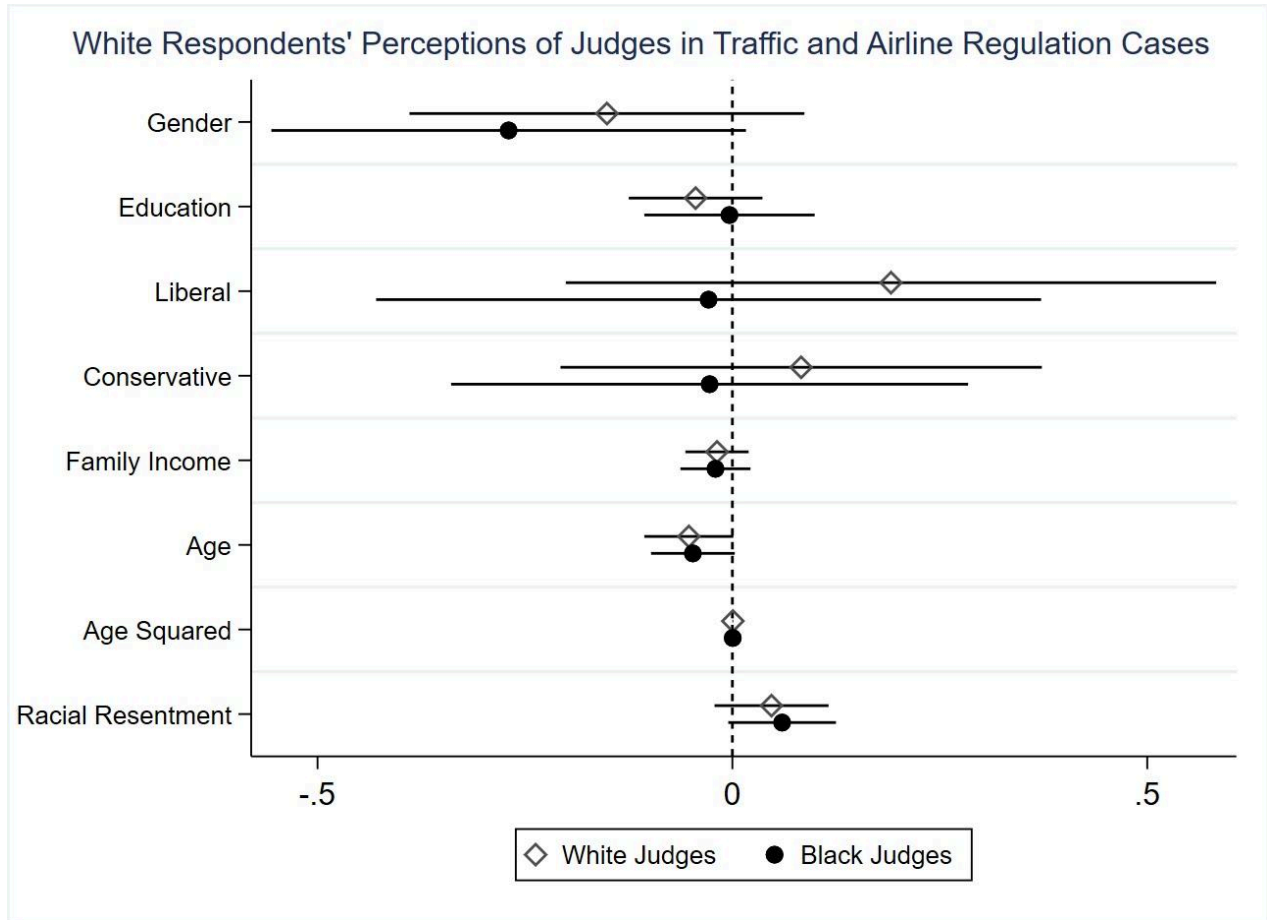

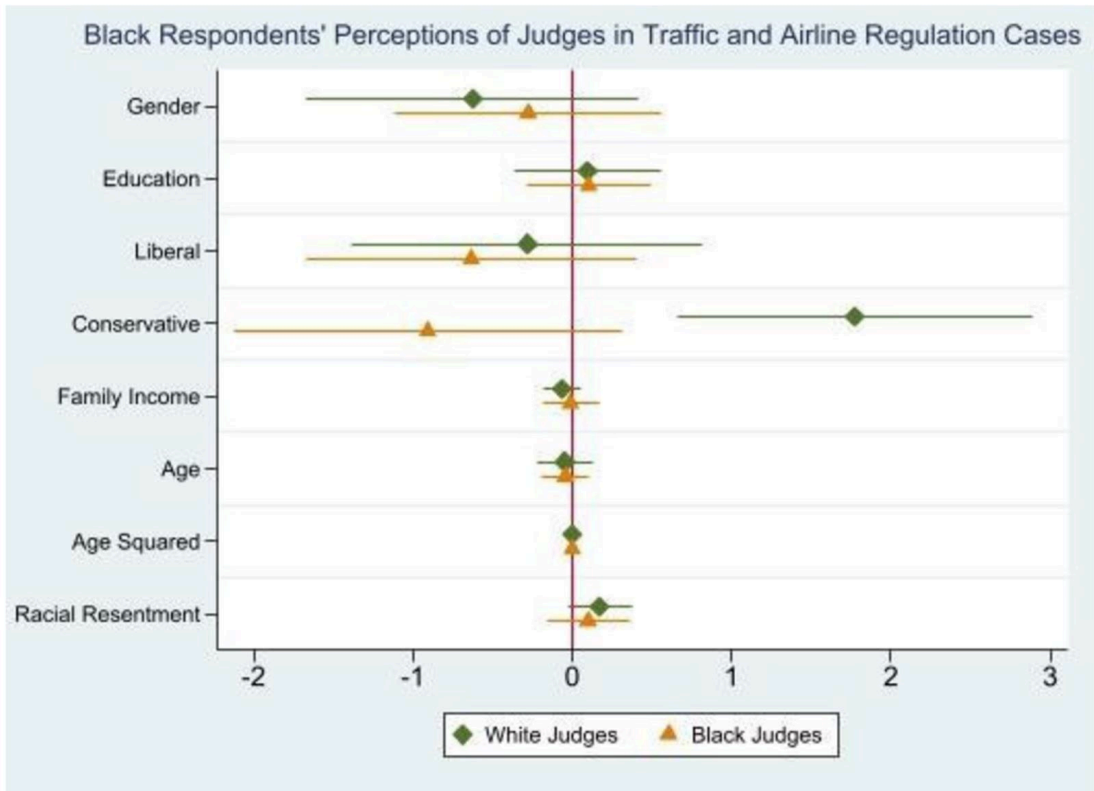

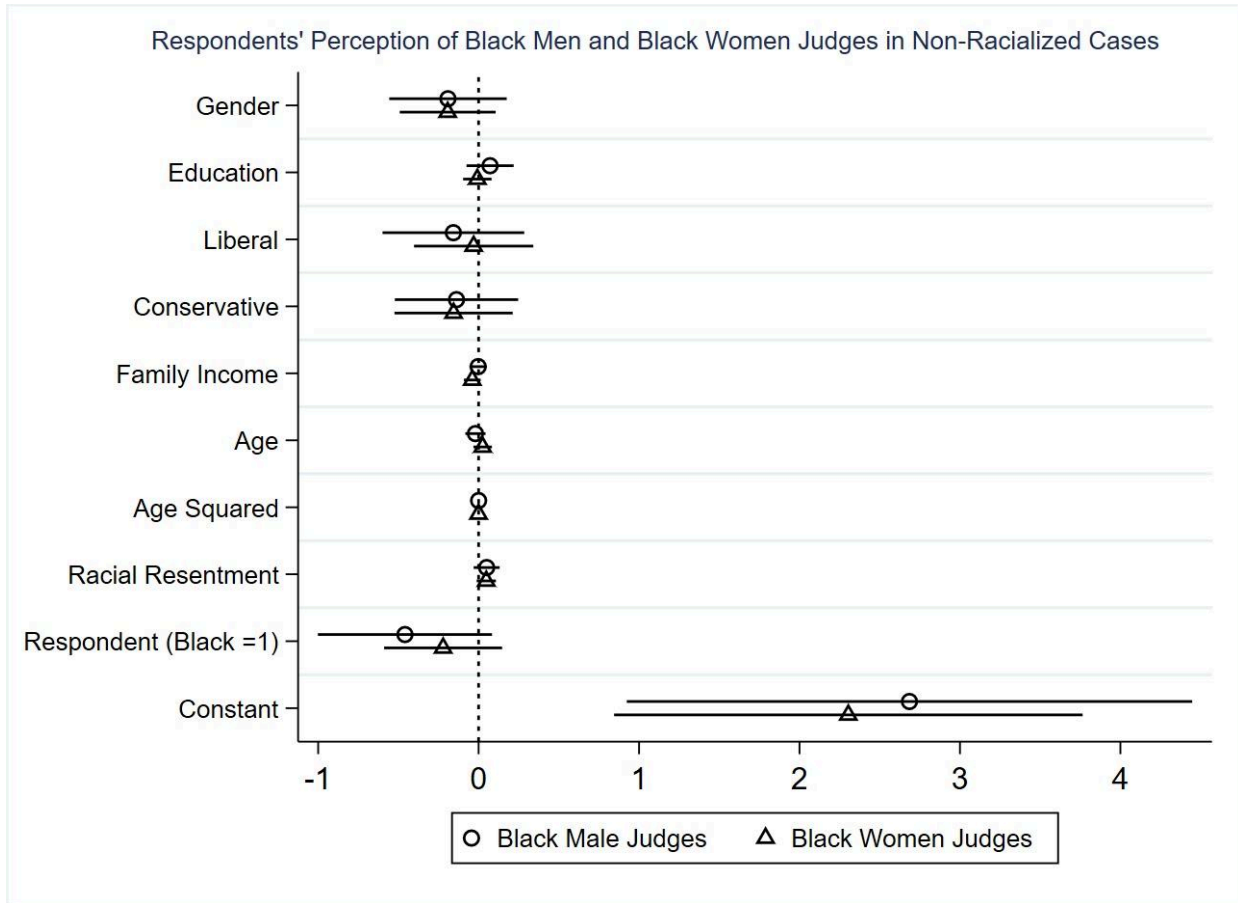

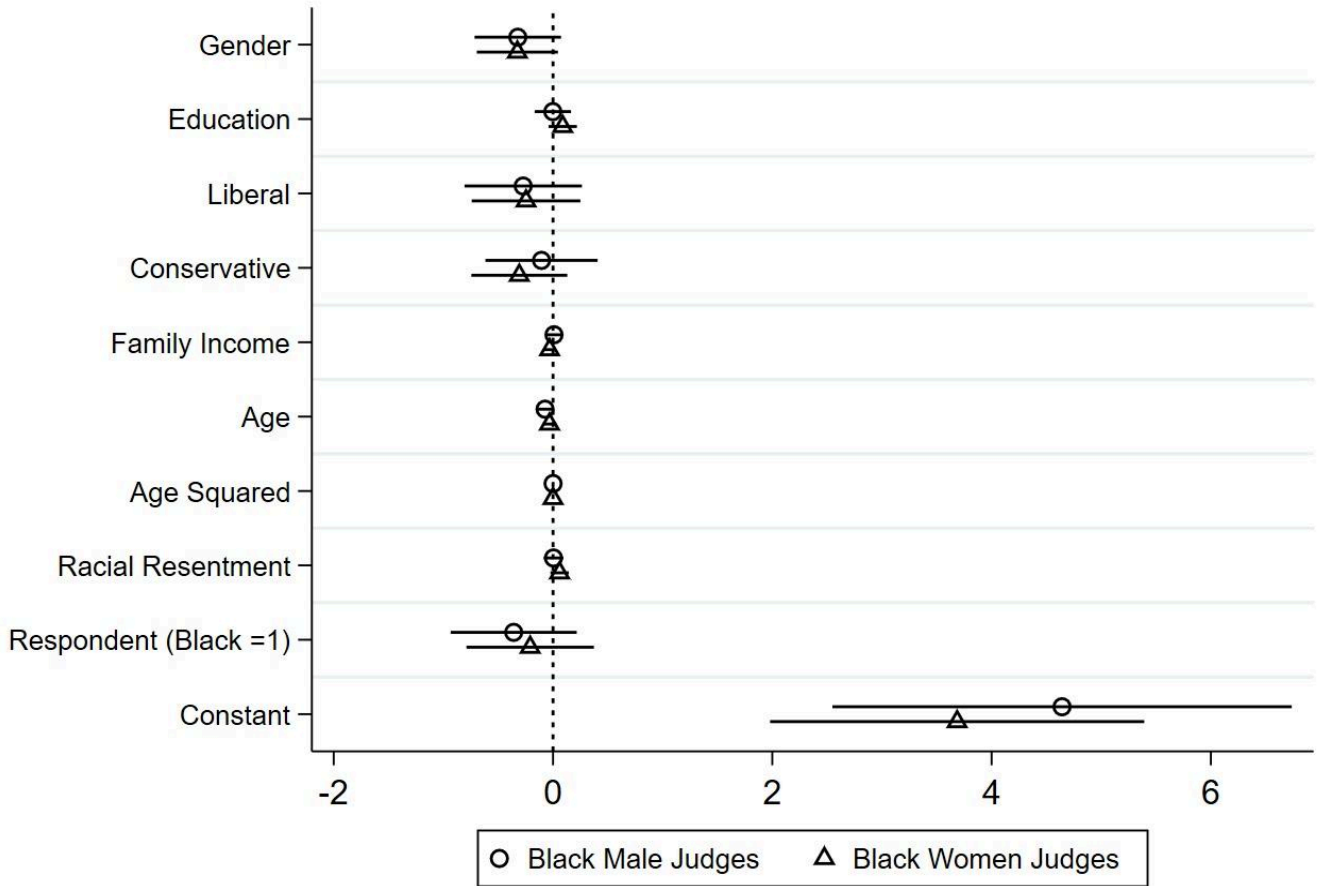
Appendix C: Perceptions of Unfairness by Race and Sex of the Judge in Non-racialized and Racialized Cases

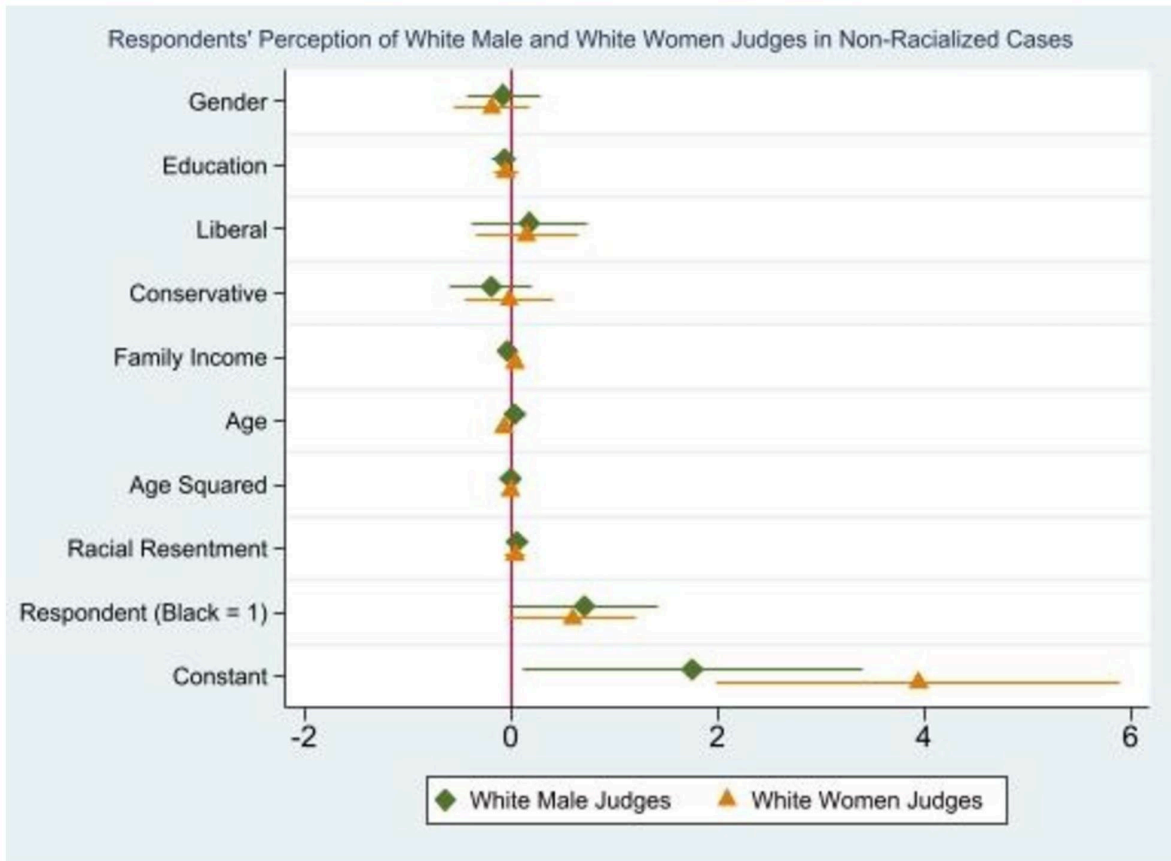
