## APPENDIX: THE 1670 NORTHUMBERLAND HOUSE INVENTORY

In 1670, following the death of Jocelyn Percy, 11th Earl of Northumberland, the estate was inventoried and appraised by Symon Stone, painter and personal assistant of the 10th Earl since the 1640s. The properties included are, in order, Petworth, Syon, ‘Apscourt’ (Apps Court, Surrey) and Northumberland House. Apps Court may have come into the family through the Devereux, who appear to have owned it in the sixteenth century. They were related to the Percys since Robert Devereux, 2nd Earl of Essex, was the uncle of the 10th Earl of Northumberland.

The inventory of Petworth House covers the entire building. It is topographically arranged while rooms seem to be entered in a logical sequence. The total value of items amounts to $£ 1,473$ 11s.

The inventory of Syon House is different from the previous one. It starts with a list of items, from tapestry and carpets, to furniture and utensils, and ends with a topographical record of some of the rooms, but since these are mainly service rooms, it would appear incomplete. The total value of the appraisal is $£ 15910$ s.

The inventory of Apps Court is a list of household objects with no topographical reference. Its total value is $£ 259$.

The inventory of Northumberland House below is the most conspicuous one, suggesting that the London house was the main residence of the family, while Petworth appears as the chief country seat. The inventory is incomplete, for the earl's lodgings, by then occupied by Jocelyn Percy, are not included. The same is true of the state rooms on the north front, while others such as the chapel or nursery, mentioned in the accounts of Robert Scawen, are not listed. In addition, the eighty-nine rooms and spaces appraised are recorded in a relatively random way, so that the document is not as informative as to the actual sequence of rooms. On the other hand, it constitutes the main source for our reconstructed plans, while it offers an interesting insight into the house and collection of the 10th Earl of Northumberland as the inventory was taken only two years after his death.

The inventory concludes with 'A note of the Pictures att Northumberland House taken / and Appraised by Mr Symon / Stone / The 30th. of June 1671', which has been omitted here as it has been transcribed and published by Wood (1994, 3048, Appendix II). The paintings are entered as a list without topographical location.
