
















Figure A-7: The Expectation of a Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1992

B. Probability of Democrat Winning General, 1992





Figure A-8: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1992

B. Probability of Republican Winning General, 1992





Figure A-9: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1992

B. Probability of Winning General, 1994





Figure A-10: The Expectation of a Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1994

B. Probability of Democrat Winning General, 1994





Figure A-11: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1994

B. Probability of Republican Winning General, 1994





Figure A-12: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1994

B. Probability of Winning General, 1996





Figure A-13: The Expectation of a Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1996

B. Probability of Democrat Winning General, 1996





Figure A-14: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1996

B. Probability of Republican Winning General, 1996





Figure A-15: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1996

B. Probability of Winning General, 1998





Figure A-16: The Expectation of a Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1998

B. Probability of Democrat Winning General, 1998





Figure A-17: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1998

B. Probability of Republican Winning General, 1998





Figure A-18: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 1998

B. Probability of Winning General, 2000





Figure A-19: The Expectation of a Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2000

B. Probability of Democrat Winning General, 2000





Figure A-20: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2000





Figure A-21: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2000





Figure A-22: The Expectation of a Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2002





Figure A-23: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2002





Figure A-24: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2002

B. Probability of Winning General, 2004





Figure A-25: The Expectation of a Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2004





Figure A-26: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2004





Figure A-27: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2004





Figure A-28: The Expectation of a Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2006





Figure A-29: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2006





Figure A-30: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2006





Figure A-31: The Expectation of a Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2008





Figure A-32: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2008

B. Probability of Republican Winning General, 2008





Figure A-33: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2008

B. Probability of Winning General, 2010





Figure A-34: The Expectation of a Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2010

B. Probability of Democrat Winning General, 2010





Figure A-35: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2010





Figure A-36: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2012

B. Probability of Winning General, 2012





Figure A-37: The Expectation of a Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2010

B. Probability of Democrat Winning General, 2012





Figure A-38: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2012

B. Probability of Republican Winning General, 2012





Figure A-39: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2012

B. Probability of a Democrat Winning General





Figure A-40: The Expectation of a Democratic Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2014

B. Probability of Republican Winning General, 2014




Figure A-41: The Expectation of a Republican Woman Winning the Primary and General Elections, 2014
