## Assessment of the current distribution and human perceptions of the Pampas cat *Leopardus colocolo* in northern Peru and southern Ecuador

SUPPLEMENTARY MATERIAL 1 Questions asked during interviews of 56 people (44 in Peru and 12 in Ecuador) to determine their perceptions of the Pampas cat *Leopardus colocolo*.

- 1. What is your primary occupation?
- 2. Are you familiar with any wild animals in the area? If so, which ones? At this point, interviewees were shown a set of 10 photographs of medium- and large-sized mammals that inhabit the Sechura Desert and seasonally dry forest:
  Pampas cat, ocelot, margay, domestic cat, Sechuran fox, striped hog-nosed skunk, tayra, opossum, puma, white-tailed deer.
- 3. If they identified the Pampas cat, we asked how they distinguished this cat from the others.
- 4. How do you perceive the Pampas cat? Positive, neutral or negative in terms of your daily activities?
- 5. Do you have any conflicts with wildlife?
- 6. Are these events usual? Do they occur during particular seasons or months?
- 7. Have you seen a predation event? How do you know which species prey upon your domestic animals?
- 8. What do you do to mitigate predation?
- 9. Have you hunted any wild animals? Why?
