## 7. GREATER LONDON

CITY OF LONDON (Londinium)

(1) Roman Wall House, Emperor House, 35–36 Vine Street and 1–2 Crutched Friars, EC3 (TQ 33590 80990): following work in 2017, two trenches were monitored in the area of the Roman City Wall<sup>1</sup> but no *in-situ* remains were observed. A single piece of ragstone, possibly associated with the wall, was found in one trench.

## **HOUNSLOW**

(1) Block G, Brentford Waterside, High Street, Brentford TW8 (TQ 17813 77399): a small assemblage of residual Roman pottery, tile and brick was recovered,<sup>2</sup> probably indicating limited activity associated with the Roman road from London to Silchester which ran c. 30 m north of the site.

## **SOUTHWARK**

(1) 596–598 and 600–608 Old Kent Road and Livesey Place, SE15 (TQ 34401 77807): although the projected line of Watling Street<sup>3</sup> runs across the northern part of the site, no evidence for this or any associated features was observed.<sup>4</sup>
