Suppl. I: Checklist for ADC-observation. This table shows the individual process steps in chronological order as well as the observation and evaluation criteria of the ADC. Optional process parameters were defined, which became necessary depending on the selected procedure for dressing change. One person alone can perform dressing changes, either by creating an aseptic storage area by using a disinfected area or by spreading a sterile cloth. Wipe disinfection of the work surface must then also be performed at the end of the dressing change. For dressing changes involving several people, it is possible for the dressing material to be opened and applied by another person with disinfected hands. In this case, the points about creating aseptic storage area and wipe disinfection at the end of the process could be omitted. Necessary steps in hand hygiene were highlighted.
