Summary of comments of respondents who never discussed faith- and culture-related issues with patients but would like to do so in future

Lack of awareness

- I need more information myself
- I wasn't aware of the presence of animal derivatives in medication (naïve of me)
- I was unaware of this issue and would not wish to knowingly give patients a substance which was against their beliefs

Access to resources

- I will look up the information and inform patients where it's relevant
- This needs to be included in trust prescribing protocol

Willingness

• I should do this if appropriate as it is part of informed consent

Fears and anxieties

- Often I assume if they have an objection then they would let me know
- May restrict medication being prescribed plus compliance
- Also I need to know what 'alternatives' are available

Respect for patient autonomy

- So patient can make an informed choice
- Respect their beliefs, helping them make informed decision
- Would not wish to knowingly give patients a substance which was against their beliefs
- We need to understand the cultural beliefs and respect them
- In order to respect people's religious beliefs, it would be important to take these factors in to consideration
