## **Description of the Chinese-American Telecollaborative Learning Program**

The Chinese-American telecollaborative learning program was a 15-week exchange project, involving two natural Chinese language classes, CHN102 (i.e., second-semester first-year Chinese) and CHN112 (i.e., second-semester second-year Chinese) at a U.S. liberal arts college and a group of Chinese-speaking English majors at a Chinese university in Shanghai. The first researcher was the instructor of CHN102 and CHN112 at the U.S. college. The teaching assistant of these two courses was a Fulbright TA, who was a faculty member at the Chinese university and responsible for convening the Chinese group.

In the first week of the semester, each student from the American group was paired up with one from the Chinese group of their own choice based on a brief biography required of each participant. Meanwhile, two separate WeChat groups were created for CHN102 and CHN112 for participants to socialize and discuss cultural topics with their partners. The Chinese-American learning program had the following four components: one-on-one Skype conversations, WeChat group cultural discussions, one-on-one WeChat conversations, and reflection journals.

CFL students from the American side were required to spend at least half an hour conducting **one-on-one Skype conversation** with their Chinese partners on one of the department lab computers, half in Chinese and half in English. These conversations were to occur on a weekly basis except for the first week, the Spring break week, and the final week, resulting in twelve Skype conversations over the course of the semester. For the part in Chinese, the Chinese language instructor provided a list of topics in Chinese within the CFL learners' vocabulary range to mitigate the problem of target language proficiency gap. For the part in English, a list of topics concurrent with the cultural themes in the Chinese textbooks was also provided, but students were welcome to switch to any other topics they found more interesting. CFL students at the U.S. college were instructed to record their Skype conversations on the lab computers.

WeChat group cultural discussion served as cross-cultural forums for the exchange, with the main working language being English. For eight weeks in the semester (i.e., weeks 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, and 12), one or two partner pairs posted a selected cultural topic as well as associated discussion questions in each class WeChat group to invite comparison and contrast of aspects of Chinese and American cultures (see Table 1). The discussion topics were supposed to be posted no later than 10pm every Sunday and closed for discussion at 10pm the following Saturday. The Chinese language instructor and the Fulbright TA participated in the WeChat group discussions mainly as observers and occasionally as facilitators when student participation was low.

The students from the American side were required to connect with their Chinese partners individually through **one-on-one WeChat conversation** on a daily basis. They were encouraged to discuss anything they were interested in and allowed to type texts, send voice messages, or video chat in English or Chinese. Five minutes of each class meeting in CHN102 and CHN112 was reserved for students to share the most interesting things they learned from their Chinese partners through this component.

For the weeks when Skype conversations occurred, every student from the American side was required to write a **reflective journal** on their experiences with the Chinese-American program due at 10pm on Sundays, with the last journal being a holistic reflection of the exchange. The goals and expectations of reflective journals were openly discussed in class at the beginning of the semester and a document titled "Guidance for Writing Reflective Journals" was handed out to the students. The students could reflect on how they liked or disliked the program and its components, what they learned, the challenges they encountered, and/or recommendations for improving the program.

The American group was required to take part in this program as it was incorporated into the syllabi of CHN102 and CHN112 and their performances in this program accounted for 20% of their final grade. In contrast, the Chinese group was selected on a volunteer basis and their participation and performance in this program were not related to their final grade in any course.

As described above, the Chinese-American exchange under discussion incorporated the most updated developments in the general field of telecollaboration into its design. Specifically, the exchange combined the e-tandem model (through one-on-one Skype conversations) and the intercultural model (through WeChat group cultural discussions), integrated different task types (i.e., information exchange tasks through one-on-one Skype and WeChat conversations, comparison-analysis tasks through WeChat group discussion, reflective tasks through journals), alleviated the issue of target language proficiency gap through various means (e.g., breaking the rule of equal L1 and L2 usage, providing scaffolding within the CFL learners' vocabulary range), and combined the use of different technological tools (i.e., Skype and WeChat).
