## 2. SUPPLEMENTARY CATALOG: THE BRICKS

The catalogue is organised by types, according to the impression technique. Within each type, subtypes are grouped according to the symbols and marks on the bricks. For each subtype, the mark/stamp version, inventory number and brick dimensions are provided. Dimensions are provided in the order "length $x$ width $x$ thickness", in cm. For fragmentary examples, only the complete dimension is given.

TYPE 1: FINGER-MARKED BRICKS
1.1. Finger-marks made with one finger

Suppl. Fig. 4: 1

Mark: two irregular circles and a wavy line traced 4.0 cm apart.
Inv. no: 2573
Brick dimensions/thickness: 3.7-4.0 cm
1.2. Finger-marks made with two fingers

Mark: one preserved concentric circle Inv. no: 2583
Brick dimensions: $28.0 \times 4.0 \mathrm{~cm}$

TYPE 2:TOOL-MADE IMPRESSIONS

### 2.1 Four-armed cross

a- Stamp: Greek cross with two intersecting impressions 5.8 cm long $\times 1.0 \mathrm{~cm}$ wide, with parallel-plain sides preceded by a square in relief. Context: 089; Inv. no: 611
Brick dimensions/thickness: $4.5 \mathrm{~cm} \quad$ Suppl. Fig. 5: 1
b- Stamp: Latin cross with two intersecting impressions 6.5 and 2.5 cm long, 0.5 and 0.4 cm wide with distinct splayed ends.

Brick dimensions: $35.0 \times 4.5 \mathrm{~cm}$

### 2.2 Four-armed cross with bar monogram

a- Stamp: Latin cross in relief, with splayed ends formed by small triangles. On the left side, 4.0 cm apart, is a horizontally impressed bar monogram. This consists of a central/horizontal arm bisecting a circle (O), perhaps producing $\Theta$ (theta) in ligature with $O$. In the center of the circle, in ligature with the horizontal arm, springs vertically one bar forming a lunate $\varepsilon$, whereas, the lower half of the circle forms a $v$.

- Stamp: Latin cross in relief, with splayed ends formed by small triangles. Below the vertical arm a triangular globule. On the left side, 3.5 cm apart, is a horizontally impressed bar monogram, identical to type 2.2a.

Brick dimensions: $28.0 \times 4.0 \mathrm{~cm}$
b- Stamp: Latin cross in relief, with splayed ends formed by small triangles. On the left side, 3.5 cm apart, is a horizontally impressed bar monogram. This is similar to type 2.2a despite an extra arm springing downward forming a central cross.

Brick dimensions: $28.0 \times 4.0 / 4.5 \mathrm{~cm}$

- Stamp: Latin cross in relief, with splayed ends formed by small triangles. On the left side, 3.0 cm apart, is a horizontally impressed bar monogram, identical to type 2.2b.

Brick dimensions: $28.0 \times 4.0 / 4.5 \mathrm{~cm}$
c- Stamp: Greek cross with two intersecting impressions, 5.0 and 4.5 cm long x 0.4 cm wide with distinct splayed ends, followed by a $\Gamma$ (gamma). Inv. no: 2579
Brick dimensions: $29.0 \times 4.0 \mathrm{~cm}$

### 2.3 Christogram

Stamp: Latin cross with two intersecting impressions, 6.0 and 3.6 cm long $\times 0.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ wide with distinct splayed ends and a rho on the right side.

Brick dimensions: $35.5 \times 29.5 \times 4.5 \mathrm{~cm}$

### 2.4 Eight-armed star

Stamp: four intersecting impressions, each measuring $6.5 \times 0.9 \mathrm{~cm}$, forming an eightarmed star. Parallel striations similar to finger-marks are also visible on the surface. Inv. no: 2574
Brick dimensions/thickness: $3.7-4.0 \mathrm{~cm}$
