#### ONLINE APPENDIX

Given the comprehensiveness and richness of the dataset used in this study, I include an online appendix to describe in more detail the sample participants and data collection. This research protocol was approved by University of Arkansas's IRB in 2016.

I engaged with 40 women in various focus groups in Illinois, Texas and Florida. The participants agreed for their responses to be reported in academic publications and that a pseudonym would be used for their name, but their demographic information would be reported. The recorded focus groups lasted between 45 minutes to an hour and a half.

- 1. Would you consider yourself liberal or conservative?
- 2. Do you feel your personal opinions about issues such as gun control, abortion, health care differs from your peers? Do they differ from other Black women that you know?
- 3. What comes to mind when you hear the phrase "Black Lives Matter?"
- 4. How do you perceive the image of Black women on your campus?
- 5. How do you perceive the image of Black women in society?
- 6. What are your perceptions of how politicians address the needs of Black women?
- 7. Do you see value in Black women seeking political office?
- 8. In your home communities are there Black women as elected officials?
- 9. Do you have any desire to run for office?
- 10. Do you belong to any organization that primarily consist of Black women? If so, why?
