Newspaper

- 1 = The Analyst
- 2 = New Dawn
- 3 = New Democrat
- 4 = The Informer
- 5 = Heritage

Name in Headline

- 1 = Yes
- 0 = No

Appearance

- 1 = Reference to appearance
- 0 = No mention of appearance

First name

- 1 = Use of first name alone
- 0 = No use of first name alone

Family roles

- 1 = Reference to family role
- 0 = No reference to family role

Family/dynastic connections

- 1 = Reference to connection to high-level politician
- 0 = No reference to family connections

Emotions

- 1 = Mention of candidate's emotions
- 0 = No mention of emotions

Age

- 1 = Reference to age
- 0 = No reference to age

Experience

- 1 = Mention of Prior Elective/appointive office
- 2 = Mention other qualifications (e.g. private sector, education)
- 3 = Mentions both prior elective/appointive office and other qualifications
- 4 = Mention lack of Qualifications
- 0 = No mention

Change

- 1 = Mention that candidate will usher in change (e.g., constitutional reform, calls for reform in education, tax system, etc.)
- 0 = No mention of change

Issues

Issue #1

Open ended-list issue: write issue (e.g. development, peace, corruption, etc.)

Gender of issue #1

- 1 = masculine
- 2 = feminine

Masculine issues

Economy, business, taxes, energy/oil, trade, employment/jobs, defense, international organizations, nuclear arms control, treaties, foreign affairs

Feminine issues

Women's rights, gender quotas, abortion, HIV/AIDS, violence against women, gay rights, women in elected office, education, health, welfare, environment, care for the elderly, childcare, parental leave, pensions, peace, corruption,

Tone of Headline

- 1 = Positive
- 2 = Negative
- 3 = Mix
- 4 = Neutral
- 5 = Not about Candidate

Tone of Article

- 1 = Positive
- 2 = Negative
- 3 = Mix
- 4 = Neutral
- 5 = Not about Candidate

Endorsement

0 = No endorsement

1 = Mention endorsement

2 = Mention possible endorsement
