



**Joseph A. Marcellino MPH, CHE, Associate Director, Emergency Management, Coney Island Hospital**

Joseph Marcellino is a nationally recognized expert in both public health emergency management and agency preparedness and response. He is currently Associate Director of Emergency Management at New York City Health and Hospitals Corporation Coney Island Hospital, where he organized and coordinated the successful evacuation, closure and reopening of the Hospital during "Hurricane Irene" and also for "Hurricane Sandy". He serves on the Board of Directors and as Chairman of the Regional Emergency Medical Services Council of NYC. Joe is also an Assistant Professor at Saint John's University and teaches Health Policy. During his career he has also served on numerous local, state and federal emergency management committees and commissions.

Prior to joining Coney Island Hospital, Joseph Marcellino has held positions in directing emergency health and medical preparedness activities for the New York City Office of Emergency Management and also in New York City Emergency Medical Services developing the emergency management action plans for the city. His educational background includes a MPH in Health Policy and Emergency Systems Management from New York Medical College and a BS from Wagner College. He is the author of fourteen published works and twenty three white papers and is the recipient of the NYC Regional Emergency Medical Services Council Leadership Award and the NYS Emergency Medical Services Leadership Award.
